Spring Fling 2019 Hostess sign ups at June 2017 General Meeting

Motion made and passed by the membership in 2013

It is moved that the Hostess Sign Up Sheet for the next Spring Fling will be available at the first general meeting after the fund raising luncheon. If a member is not at the meeting, a proxy can sign the absent member's name. All applying members will be assigned one table on the first sign up round. If there are more hostesses than the current number of tables (which is 22 at this time after making provision for a Club Table), all proposed hostess' names will be randomly selected from a container until all tables are assigned. If there are more tables than hostesses and there are more potential hostesses than unassigned tables who wish to host a second table, the proposed hostess names will be placed in a container and pulled at random until all tables have a hostess. This procedure will be followed only at the first meeting after the fund raising luncheon. If there are still available tables after that meeting, any member can sign up for the unassigned tables.

In Review:

- We have 27 Tables . 9 72" rounds to seat 12 guests and 18 72"x 60" ovals to seat 11.
- Hostesses will start sign ups at 5:30 at the June 2017 General Meeting. Loretta Huebler will be seated in the lobby as you enter the building. Sign ups end at 7:15.
- After all hostesses have signed up for 1 table, a drawing will be held for hostesses wanting 2 tables.
- A drawing will be held to decide who can have one each of the nine 72" round tables to seat 12 guests
- Loretta will announce the outcome during the meeting.

Education – Diane Stiller

Sheri Redd taught the very elegant Chickadees and Roses on a glass block class. If you ever wanted to know how to paint on glass, this was the class to attend as it was very informative.

After almost cancelling the Glenice Moore class three times, I was very happy and relieved that we actually held the class! The day that I was to pick Glenice up from the airport, the Atlanta airport closed due to high winds which caused the other airports to have to reroute planes. Glenice was stuck in Minneapolis and wasn't sure that she could get rescheduled on another flight; but lots of prayers later, she arrived. The class was held at the Warren Valley Golf & Banquet Center and many of the attendees were impressed with the facility and the lunches that were served; definitely someplace to keep in mind for future classes. The winners of the raffles are as follows: Saturday: Sue Hazelton - \$25 purchase credit; Denise Robert - \$15 purchase credit; and Sandy Tyo – 12 pack of Traditions paint from Glenice. Doreen McLain taught the Elaine Thompson Roses and Pansies class. It was interesting to learn the very loose, painterly method to paint these roses.

We will wrap up the first half of the year with Mark Menendez's color pencil classes. Please note that his Friday class will be held at St. Matt's Church on 6 Mile Road; Saturday and Sunday at the Livonia Senior Center. Please contact Joan Mueller to order a Subway lunch for Sunday. Margaret Pedersen will let you know what luncheon arrangements she is making for Friday and Saturday. We will then have three classes left in the year: Prudy Vannier's egret, Michelle Handley's mixed media class using a Chris Haughey pattern, and Mary Wiseman's Magnolia. Please send in your registration forms and don't miss out on these classes.

How to resize a pattern. Have you wasted a lot of paper, pulled your hair out in frustration, and spent a lot of money trying to resize a pattern? Problem solved! Simply divide the size of the pattern that you want by the size of the pattern that you have and then multiply by 100%. For example, to reduce a pattern that is 15 inches long to fit a surface that is 12 inches long, divide 12 by 15 than multiply by 100% ($12/15 \times 100\% = 80\%$). Scan the pattern at 80%. To enlarge a pattern that is 12 inches long to fit a surface that is 15 inches long, divide 15 by 12 than multiply by 100% ($15/12 \times 100\% = 125\%$). Scan the pattern at 125%.

Vote for Big Brushes for 2018 classes. I will be taking a vote to determine which Big Brush(es) you would like to consider teaching in 2018. I am also looking for 2 teachers for next year. If you are interested in teaching a class, please email me ASAP. In addition, I will have three projects for you to vote on.




