

October General Meeting Info



Education – Diane Stiller

Nine of us joined Nancy Silver who taught one of the last free SDP paint-ins on zoom. It was the Hallingdal strokework pattern by Lise Lorentzen. Nancy reminded us that when we paint the basecoat that we should already be applying it using the same stroke as we will subsequently for further coats. Also, that to make nicely formed comma strokes, we should be lifting the end of the brush towards the ceiling, not dragging the brush across the surface. Thanks Nancy, it's always nice to have our memory refreshed on some of these finer points.









Nancy Vincent taught 16 of us how to use acrylic washes and airbrush paint. She likes to use acrylic paint as once it dries it doesn't reactivate unlike watercolor paint. This helps when you want to add additional acrylic washes. Nancy also likes to use Createx airbrush paint as once it dries, it doesn't reactivate which is important when you want to add color washes or spray varnish the surface when you're done. She doesn't use micron pens, for instance, since they will bleed and smear if they get wet. Createx is water soluble and can be purchased at Dick Blick's. It comes in many colors, including white. You would dilute it in a separate small container with enough water to retain the pigment but make it flow easier from the nib of the pen. She also recommends that you clean the nib with hand sanitiser as the nib can rust if you leave the ink on to dry.




Spring Fling 2023 Report

Education – Diane Stiller

Tracy Moreau class

Thirty individuals had a great time with Tracy, the first Big Brush to teach on-site since 2019. The paper poppy was a multi-media class and used lots of products. The most interesting product was made by Pebeo called Gedeo Mixtion Relief (Adhesive). We used the fine tip to trace around the leaves and petals. It comes out white and is clear when dry. When dry (can take at least 20 minutes), it is tacky so that you can then rub the gold leaf on with your fingers. You can also use this product with stencils. You can purchase this product at Dick Blicks. You can put Triple Thick into a bottle with a fine tip and use that to flood each area of the design to get a beautiful glossy sheen. Tracy sells a Uniball signo.38 fine tip black gel pen that she buys from Japan. She provided DecoArt's Media Fluid Acrylics and Extreme Sheen Metallics for our use.

Tracy also showed us how to use the DecoArt Metallic Lustre Waxes. They can be used just like any other acrylic paint. If the wax has dried out, place a wet piece of paper towel on top, close the lid tight, and it will begin to soften. She also suggested that for any of the mediums that the opening of the container be cleaned before placing the lid back on so that the container is sealed tightly to prevent the medium from drying out so quickly.

Tracy did a Wheel of Names / game for Giveaways won by: Saturday, Mary Jane Wells, Kay Fradaneck, and Kathy Ziemba Sunday, Denise Robert, Kathy Helm, and Patty Neu













In addition to the poppy, Tracy gave everyone a rose pattern as an option to use. These are her two different color schemes for the roses. The 3^{rd} photo is an example of using the mixtion relief with a stencil.

DecoArt Metallic Lustre Waxes

Thanks Karen and Nancy! It was fun and nice to end the year on a high note. Check out the 2022 Education financial report to see how we did.





Education Surveys

June (written) (Appendix 3)

The results reflect a positive view of getting back to our pre-Covid years.

The majority of members indicated that their favorite medium is acrylic.

The majority are in favor of the seating arrangements for classes on-site.

The majority want to bring snacks to share and have VP provide the lunch for a fee.

By an extremely slim majority (of 1 or 2 votes), members would like on-site local and national classes based on good/bad weather months, but Zoom is acceptable.

Financial Statement at December 31 (Appendix 4)

Records were audited twice and successfully completed.

Community Service

Memory Boxes – 71 boxes were painted of which 26 were donated to us by Brush Benders.

35 were donated to Children's Hospital and 36 to Beaumont Botsford for a total of 71.

16 painted boxes are waiting for delivery next year.

<u>Treasure Boxes</u> - 16 boxes were turned in during 2022. None were delivered during 2022 and none will be delivered until there are 30. So far there are 22 finished boxes (2021 & 2022 combined).

Fall Retreat – Raised \$400 to support Camp Skyline for children

Holiday Party - Donated toys, food, and books to Toys for Tots, Social Services, and The Little Free Library.

General Meetings

February was via zoom. HOME sign with interchangeable "O's" is our project for the year.

April was first meeting back on-site since covid restrictions became effective.

\$3668 (Income) less \$4010 (Expenses) = -\$342 (VP Treasury) 70 pence used for registration.

Society of Decorative Painters Dec 16, 2022 (Appendix 7 and Appendix 8)

Results of the Vote The motion has been approved to reorganize the Society of Decorative Painters into the SDP Foundation. The results were 1211 total votes cast, 1092 Yes votes and 119 No votes. The Decorative Painter's Academy and the Certification Programs, including the MDA, CDA, ADP, and TDA programs, have been transferred and managed by the Foundation for several months and these programs will continue into the future with your continued support. The final assets and liabilities of the Society of Decorative Painters will be transferred to the SDP Foundation and will become the responsibility of the Foundation board. The Society of Decorative Painters website, Facebook pages and associated emails will no longer be active after December 31, 2022.

The SDP Board will assist the new Foundation Board in this transition and then will either step down or offer to support them in another capacity if needed.
