

Boutique updates for Spring Fling

Since we are at a new venue, with new times and such, I would like to review some things regarding the Boutique. Please familiarize yourself with this if you are participating.

General info:

- Hours for selling are currently under review. Originally we would open at 1pm. Stay tuned.
- We are in need of volunteers for all positions:, set up, cashier, wrapper, floor workers, and take down. We need to vacate the venue by 5 pm.
- 3. More than likely our set up time will be 9am on that Sunday, not the night before.
- 4. No repairs on items will be possible. If damaged they can be sold at discount if donor agrees. Please provide appropriate accessories: batteries, hangers on back, etc.

Set up:

- 1. Please allow the Boutique to <u>bring in ALL</u> the boxes and shelving before unloading your items for tables. Michelle, Diane, and Pat will be there at 9(or before as we have the bulk of items already). Please allow us to park right at the door until all items are brought inside. Any other help with unloading will be welcome! Boutique set up will then commence.(and yes we will move our vehicles)
- 2. Many of our members will be bringing items for sale the morning of the boutique. Please put your <u>COMPLETED</u> Inventory list in the box which will be labelled "Inventory". This is a necessary accounting to be sure you receive appropriate pence. Then place your item on an appropriate place on the shelving, The blank inventory list form will be emailed to all members prior to the Spring Fling. Please <u>complete BEFORE</u> arriving to facilitate flow.
- 3. Please <u>PRICE</u> your items <u>BEFORE</u> arriving as well. I will have ticketing items(and red dots) at the next General meeting for your use. I prefer tags with string as opposed to stickers as they do not fall off as much. But do what you can; you can supply your own tags.
- 4. Please mark the items you want returned with a large red permanent ink dot or sticker. This will greatly assist the post boutique sorting processes. Also fill out a <u>separate RETURN REQUESTED</u> form which will be emailed along with the inventory list.
- 5. All unsold items at the close of the Boutique will be immediately packed and brought to Michelle's house for inventory. No unsold items can be taken home the day of Spring Fling. Items to be returned will be sorted and brought to the General Meeting the following week. No pence is awarded for returned items.

Thanks Karen and Nancy! It was fun and nice to end the year on a high note. Check out the 2022 Education financial report to see how we did.






The registration form is included in the newsletter and was emailed to all members. Please start registering for this class at the February meeting. It is the first class of the year following the Spring Fling.

Education Surveys

June (written) (Appendix 3)

The results reflect a positive view of getting back to our pre-Covid years.

The majority of members indicated that their favorite medium is acrylic.

The majority are in favor of the seating arrangements for classes on-site.

The majority want to bring snacks to share and have VP provide the lunch for a fee.

By an extremely slim majority (of 1 or 2 votes), members would like on-site local and national classes based on good/bad weather months, but Zoom is acceptable.

August (by hand vote)

A majority of the members present (15) voted to have only one class taught by a local (member) teacher (the range was 0 to 3 local teachers). A majority of the members (18) voted to continue to hold the free SDP Paint-Ins via Zoom on Wednesdays instead of painting them after the general meetings.

Financial Statement at December 31 (Appendix 4)

Records were audited twice and successfully completed.

Community Service

Memory Boxes – 71 boxes were painted of which 26 were donated to us by Brush Benders.

35 were donated to Children's Hospital and 36 to Beaumont Botsford for a total of 71.

16 painted boxes are waiting for delivery next year.

<u>Treasure Boxes</u> - 16 boxes were turned in during 2022. None were delivered during 2022 and none will be delivered until there are 30. So far there are 22 finished boxes (2021 & 2022 combined).

Fall Retreat – Raised \$400 to support Camp Skyline for children

Holiday Party - Donated toys, food, and books to Toys for Tots, Social Services, and The Little Free Library.

General Meetings

February was via zoom. HOME sign with interchangeable "O's" is our project for the year.

Don't Look game: without looking, draw a heart, leprechaun hat, and arms holding a shamrock.

April was first meeting back on-site since covid restrictions became effective.

Game was to build the tallest stand-alone tower using a marshmallow, 20 pieces of spaghetti, a yard of tape, and a yard of ribbon.

June - boutique paint-in: cat on wine bottle.

August - trunk sale and annual picnic

October – Activity was painting flowers using spoons.

December – Annual holiday party: Gnome for the Holidays (Appendix 5 and Appendix 6)

<u>General Meeting Survey</u> - 37 members responded by email and 6 voted at the Holiday Luncheon, a total of 43 votes. 39 voted to move the General Meetings permanently to Saturday starting in 2023. 4 voted to have the General Meetings remain on Thursday.

Fall Retreat – Woodland theme at Skyline Camp. 22 attended of which 4 were non-members.

\$3668 (Income) less \$4010 (Expenses) = -\$342 (VP Treasury) 70 pence used for registration.

4 classes were taught by Nancy Silver, Sam Farah, and Eileen Carroll.

Society of Decorative Painters Dec 16, 2022 (Appendix 7 and Appendix 8)

Results of the Vote The motion has been approved to reorganize the Society of Decorative Painters into the SDP Foundation. The results were 1211 total votes cast, 1092 Yes votes and 119 No votes. The Decorative Painter's Academy and the Certification Programs, including the MDA, CDA, ADP, and TDA programs, have been transferred and managed by the Foundation for several months and these programs will continue into the future with your continued support. The final assets and liabilities of the Society of Decorative Painters will be transferred to the SDP Foundation and will become the responsibility of the Foundation board. The Society of Decorative Painters website, Facebook pages and associated emails will no longer be active after December 31, 2022.

The SDP Board will assist the new Foundation Board in this transition and then will either step down or offer to support them in another capacity if needed.
