#### Livonia Senior Wellness Center


Well Ladies, it is finally happening! We will no longer be meeting at the Livonia Civic Park Senior Center located on Farmington Rd. just south of 5 Mile Rd. Karl Peters, the Program Supervisor, took Linda Christopher, Linda Morgan, and I on a tour of the new facility on October 22. Their new move date is November 17 though there is still a lot of work to do. However, whether they meet that deadline or not, we will have our February 7, 2026 Member meeting at the new location.

Where is it? The Livonia Senior Wellness Center is built on to the east side of the Livonia Parks & Recreation Building located at 15100 Hubbard Street in Livonia. It is between Farmington Rd. and Merriman; closer to Merriman. Those who attend activities/classes at the Parks & Recreation Building use Hubbard St. to enter the parking lot in the rear of the building. Only recreation members can enter the building through those back doors.

Members of Village of Decorative Painters will enter the parking lot off of 5 Mile Rd. This parking lot is specifically for use by those entering the Senior Wellness Center. In the picture below, the doors are to the left where the two awnings are. You can see handicapped parking signs on the right and there are more handicapped spaces on the left (east) side of the building. General parking is on the left side of the building and there are more spaces than at the old building.

This is the east side of the Senior Wellness Center and you can see handicapped parking. In front of the grass in the foreground is the start of general parking.

When you enter the building, someone will be at the front desk to direct people. You go down the corridor on the right and then turn left for the elevators. Our room is on the second floor right by the elevators.

All the chairs and tables are light and on wheels. The new tables measure 5 feet wide and 2 feet in depth. The chairs have arms that fold up/down. We will have to see if we can fit 2 people to one table. The chairs and tables will be in the room and set up classroom style. We can easily move them to reconfigure the room for our needs for meetings or classes.





The elevators are quite large. We can bring our wagons and can also use the carts from their dining room.



The room looks to be at least as large as the Activity room. Where you see the door to the far left, the room can be divided so the smaller space will be used for when the tests that are administered during several months can be held; which usually meant that we couldn't use the Activity room at all at the old building.

The room is carpeted and well lit. There is only one window to the far right which is built high up the wall. There will be two TV's mounted on the wall to the right. We should still be able to use the movie screen.




This shows the built-in counter that we can place food on. There is a sink. The bathrooms are near the room.

#### Could You Use a Bit of Sunshine? - Diane Stiller



#### Caramelized Onion and Brie Dip

#### **Ingredients**

3 T unsalted butter (or bacon grease per Dawn)

2 onions, thinly sliced

2 t fresh thyme leaves

½ t pepper

8 oz Brie cheese, thinly sliced

1/2 C Parmigiano Reggiano cheese, shredded

Fresh vegetables or crackers to serve

#### **Directions**

In a large skillet over medium high heat, add butter. Once melted, add onions and cook until caramelized, about 15 - 20 minutes. Place in an overproof serving dish.

Heat broiler to high.

Sprinkle thyme and pepper over onions, then add brie and parmesan cheeses.

Place under broiler until bubbling and golden brown.






